ResourceCo Asia are assisting clothing recycler Lifeline clothing reduce waste into Landfil.

Used clothing and household textiles are widely collected and resold as cleaning rags, but what happens to the textiles that cant be converted?

Lifeline Clothing started operations in March 2015 and now produces 12 to 15 tonnes of cleaning cloths each week.

The factory is aiming for “zero waste”, which means they aim to recycle everything that comes into the factory.

The unwanted textile scraps which cannot be turned into cleaning cloths, such as “silky” materials (polyster, spandex, lycra) and those with zippers, sequins or plastic beads, are sent to ResourceCo Asia.

The ResourceCo Asia Processing facility in Ipoh recycles the textile scraps by blending them with other materials to produce engineered fuel for cement kilns.

This means that no material or textiles are sent to landfill.

As part of ResourceCo’s traceability commitment, we consolidate what you send to us at the end of every month and tabulate estimated CO2 and landfill mitigation results for your record and CSR programs.

We are also able to provide other communication materials such as videos and photos for your CSR or marketing/sales programs.
